Council Seeks Parade Volunteers

TCVC launched the special parade website in support of this year’s Veterans Day observance. The website focuses on the annual parade that’s organized by TCVC and hosted by the City of Fort Worth.

The site offers visitors a wealth of information about Veterans Day, according to organizers. Parade volunteers, participants, spectators and donors can all interact on the site, gathering information about the parade and the history of Veterans Day.

“Saluting Our Nation” is the theme of this year’s event, stepping off on Wednesday, November 11, at 11 a.m. in Fort Worth. Participants will march up Belknap St., around the Tarrant County Courthouse, down Commerce St., across 5th St., up Houston St. to Belnap and back down Belknap to the assembly area in the Panther Island Pavilion parking lot.

The City of Fort Worth, along with TCVC, is planning the celebration in concert with the Nation’s 250th anniversary. Fort Worth’s annual Veterans Day salute began 107 years ago as an armistice procession through downtown in 1919 to honor those who had fought in World War I.

“Everyone can join our veterans salute. That includes military veterans who have, are and will continue to make great contributions,” notes TCVC President Dan Zmroczek. “Simply visit our website where you can learn how to support, volunteer, and take part.

“Will you consider joining this year’s festivities?” Zmroczek asks. “If you’re not available, please help us spread the word. A parade poster’s also available online to download and distribute. Hope y’all can join us in saluting Vietnam veterans.”
